Main Idea/Summary	Waiting for the expected leads to adoration
Scripture	1 John 4:13-16

QUESTIONS	
About God	1 John 4:13 says that whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in them. God loves us so much that he gave us the ultimate gift of life through his son, Jesus. What does this say about God's perpetual love for us? Are we loving others the way God loves us?
About Me	Waiting for the unknown can create anxiety. (worrying about things we have no control over, certain expectations to be met, etc) But waiting for the expected can lead to adoration. We know that all our hope should be in Jesus, but sometimes the "hustle and bustle" of life can lead us astray. 1 John 4:16 says "And so we know and rely on the love God has for us." Where have you been placing your hope lately? How can you move away from your anxieties and toward Jesus?
Community	Pastor Jeffery voiced that worship is a posture, a pervasive lifelong attitude. How was the idea of worship modeled for you when you were growing up? How can you move toward Worship with your own family/community, aside from coming to church?
Mission	Worship is a way we live our daily lives whether it be at work, in the grocery store, with family eating dinner or in a coffee shop. When we worship, we are reminded of who God is, what He has done and what he will do. How does this idea of worship being an attitude change how you can engage with others day to day, especially during this season?
Action	Who is someone who has been on your heart lately? Maybe they have been experiencing difficult times. Maybe they don't have a relationship with God. Whatever the case is, they are on your heart for a reason. Let them know and ask how you can pray for them.

Lord, thank you for fulfilling your promises to us. We rejoice in the fact that you are bigger than the problems we face. We are grateful that we can know and rely on the love you have for us. Let us find our rest in You. Let us remember that we are not the center of our world, but You are the center of everything. Amen.
